## School Achievements

The data for 2019 cohort has been published on the [school website](http://schoolwebsite). There are two key pieces of data for each cohort.

**Attainment**—This refers to whether a pupil is working 'at the expected level' or 'working at greater depth'.

**Progress** – This refers to how well pupils have progressed in their learning from their starting point at our school.

**Early Years** remains a school strength with Good Level of Development (75%) exceeding the Local Authority and National Average.

**Phonics** is also a strength of the school with 93% exceeding Local Authority and National Average by nearly 10%.

## KS1—

Reading 77% was in line with Local Authority and higher than National Average.

Writing 67%—was slightly below Local Authority and in line with National Average.

Maths 87%—exceeded Local and National by 10% and is a strength of the school.

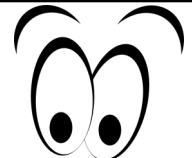
