On school site please:-

- 1. Children to walk on site independently as before.
- 2. Maintain social distancing by not arriving early and gathering at the school gate. Arrive no earlier than 3.10 for Reception and KS1 and 3.15 for KS 2 children.
- 3. Wear a face covering.
- 4. Use HCSB for messages
- 5. Only one adult on site please to collect children.

These simple measures, together with regular handwashing, remain the best way to keep us all safe.

We are following guidance on increased ventilation so your child will need an extra layer during the school day. Staff will now voluntarily be wearing face coverings, in communal spaces in school.

Self-isolation period reduced from 14 days to 10 days

Self-isolation is essential to reducing the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) as it breaks the chains of transmission. After reviewing the evidence, the Department for Health and Social Care is now confident that we can reduce the number of days that contacts self-isolate from 14 days to 10 days. This was set out in the <u>UK Chief Medical Officers' statement on the self-isolation period</u> on 11 December.

EPS Communication

 - \Rightarrow Mrs Warrington who is our Deputy Head Teacher and leads Year 3 & 4
 - \Rightarrow Mr Northedge who lead Year 5 & 6

<u>Telephone messages</u>: As members of staff are in classrooms 'phone messages will only be returned when possible. Please note: When parents request a response, the most appropriate colleague will follow up.
