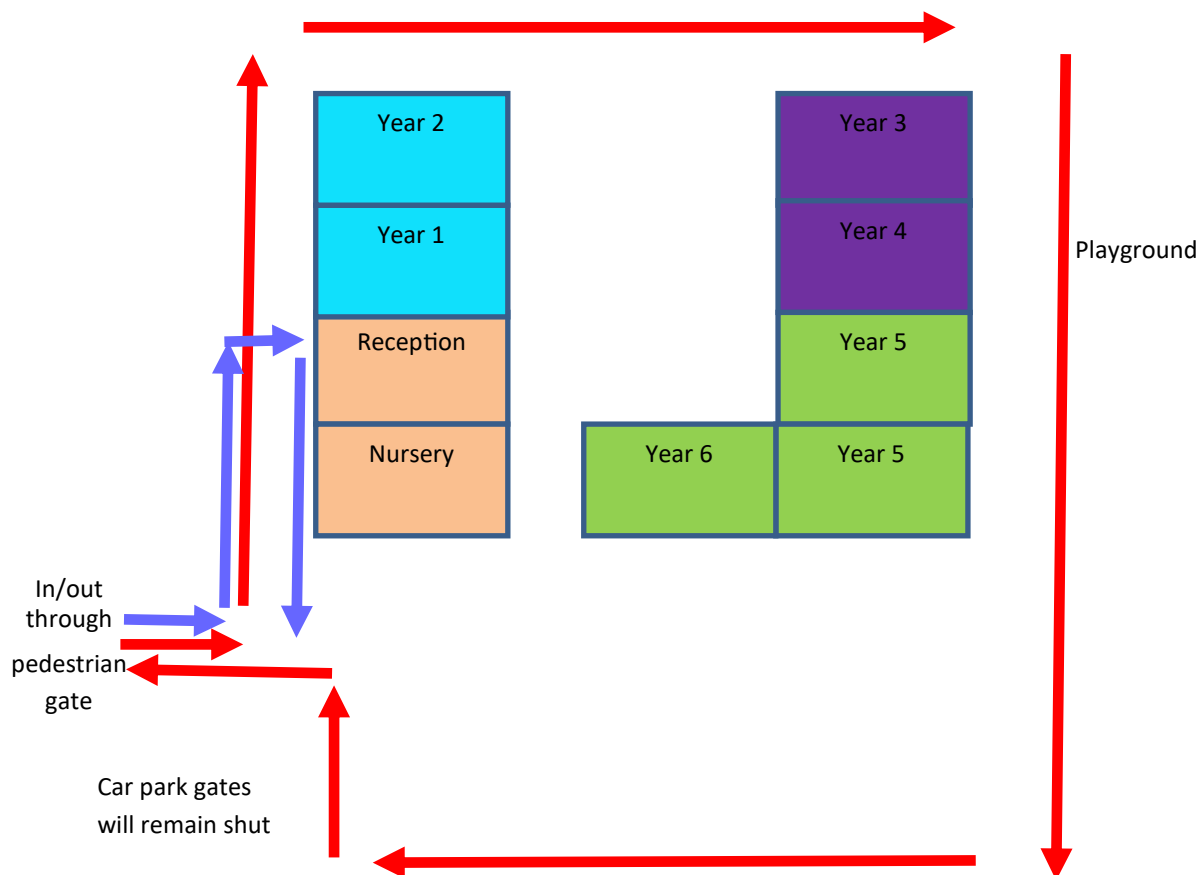

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## Coronavirus update :-

At the moment the government is saying it is likely that the restrictions will be lifted on 19th July. The procedures at school will remain in place until the end of the term.

We should give some thought to what school may look like in September.

There are many 'unknowns' that could take place over the summer break such as a local outbreak, a new variant of concern nationally as travel opens up more etc.

It may be necessary to continue with the current practice for longer.

### If all is well:-

- Before school there will be the same morning procedure with staff outside school gates.
- Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 to walk in independently.
- Nursery, Reception, Year 1 & 2 children will be escorted in by a parent.
- At end of school day Parents to collect from classroom doors and use one way system around school site as illustrated on previous page.
- We respectfully ask that parents still socially distance on the playground as the virus has not gone away.
- In school handwashing procedures will be maintained
- The car park gate will no longer be in use.
- Please keep school informed of any positive cases

If there is a **local or national peak** in number of the virus we will:-

- Ask year 1 & 2 to walk in independently
- Nursery & Reception must be escorted onto the school site
- Class bubbles will be reinstated.
- Face coverings are expected
- Only one parent on site
- Social distancing will apply.
