Thank you to all our parents who have followed the school's guidance on how to use the school site. There has been a happy start to the school year.

Reminder for families who are new to Eastlands Primary School

- Parking
 - Please park away from the school site. We are working hard with our parents to reduce pollution build up around the school gates. Also this is safer for children as many of our 5 & 6 children walk to school independently.
 - Ideally walk, cycle or scoot. I have noticed so many more families choosing this option to travel to school. Thank you.
 - If you have to drive to school please park about 10 minute walk away from school. Children like a little walk to school as 'it wakes their brain up' (quote from start of year assembly).
 - Engines need to be switched off to reduce fumes from engine idling. Once again thank you to families that are aware of this.
 - Do not park over the drives ways of neighbours.
- School site — PHE data is showing a steep rise in COVID numbers in Rugby. We have several strategies to keep COVID number in our school as low as possible and protect our most vulnerable pupils and families.
 - One adult on site to drop off or collect children.
 - Year 1 & 2 families to use the one way system around the main playground. This was also a parental request from the January survey as many of you preferred the one way system. It also avoids parents having to walk on the grass to pass each other.
 - Year 3—6 pupils to come in independently in the mornings.
 - We request you wear face coverings on site as in many other establishments.
 - **Parent meetings will be though teams**

Thank you for all your cooperation as we move into the winter months.

We are hopeful that these actions will keep COVID numbers at our school down to a mini-
