Coronavirus update & Information & FAQ's

1. School situation to date:-

- Over the last week we have had several cases of Coronavirus in school. Each time new cases are confirmed we will contact families in the year group.
- If your child is off with coronavirus symptoms please use Oak Academy to access work initially as the class teacher will be teaching the children on site in class. You will get a text notification when work has been made available for your child.

2. Staffing:-

 We have had several members of staff, who are double vaccinated, who have contracted COVID since July. As yet long COVID has not been a serious issue for us.



- At times these member of staff have been too unwell to work. It is becoming very clear that staffing capacity will impact on school provision in some form.
 - Examples of this impact could include:-
 - Reduced capacity in the office
 - Fewer places been offered in BSAS
 - Classes being covered by other staff.
 - We ask for your continued support at times of additional pressure.
- Safeguarding and wellbeing will always be prioritised

3. If your child has tested positive.

- If your child is feeling well, they should use Oak Academy and BBC bitesize in the first instance. Children will always have access to some learning from home and both links are added to year group pages on website.
- As teachers are in the classroom with the pupils in school they will not be able to put
 up work for absent pupils until the end of the day at the earliest. Teachers are also
 trying to put up current work for absent pupils so will adapt, where possible, the
 learning that is taking place in the classroom for your child to access. This will take
 a little time.
- If your child is too unwell to learn at home please let us know so staff do not produce work that will not be used. Thank you.

Jewellery of any kind should not be worn. The only exception to this would be a watch which must be removed for PE. If ears are pierced then studs only should be worn as any other type of earing poses a serious health and safety issue.
