The government have relaxed rules called Plan B in recent days. In school we are still advised by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in terms of the local situation. Rugby as a build up area still tends to show high numbers of COVID cases. Nationally the number of cases appear to be reducing but it could be a very inaccurate indicator as we are told we no longer need to PCR and it is unsure how many people are still reporting positive LFD.
