School Travel news

Thank you to so many parents for your careful and thoughtful parking behaviours outside school gates before and at the end of the school day. These behaviours ensure all our children are safe when travelling in the local area. We are actively discouraging parents from parking near to school gates to keep exhaust fumes down to a minimum. Please use alternative car parking at Whinfield or GEC car park.

In school we work closely with children, parents and our neighbours on ensuring the space around the main school gates is safe for all.

There is some further action we can take.

- 1. Please remember: The Highway Code's Rule 243 states that you should 'not stop or park where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles, or where it would obstruct cyclists except when forced to do so by stationary traffic.' Parking a vehicle fully or partially across a dropped kerb is classed as an obstruction and either the police or local council can enforce the contravention.
- 2. We are planning a Car Free day on Friday 31st March. Hopefully the weather will be a little brighter and warmer on that day. Please think about walking to school if possible, parking 10 minutes away from school or using the alternate car parks the we have advertised over this school year.
